## University profiles



Florida A&M is located in Tallahassee. It is the 5<sup>th</sup>  
largest historically black university (HBCU) in the  
United States by enrollment and the only public  
historically black university in Florida.

The acceptance rate for FAMU for incoming  
freshmen is 31%. The graduation rate for first time,  
full time students is 40% within 6 years.

The university offers 54 bachelor's degrees, 29  
master's degrees, one professional degree, and 12  
doctoral degrees. It has 12 schools and colleges.  
Some of the best degrees from this university are  
pharmaceutical sciences and law.

Notable alumni are Smitty (Rapper) and former  
mayor of Tallahassee, Andrew Gillum. He also ran  
for governor!

## Historical significance of HBCUs

In a segregated, post-Civil War country,  
historically black colleges and universities  
provided black Americans with a quality  
education. Many well-known and respected  
artists, politicians, CEOs and political leaders  
are graduates of the institutions. Today, these  
colleges are still some of the country's top  
producers of black doctors, scientists and  
engineers and offer opportunities to a more  
diverse student body. Around 25% of black  
doctorate recipients earned a bachelor's degree  
from an HBCU, according to the National  
Science Foundation.
