Money for College!



It is very important for this year's seniors to apply to various scholarships and financial aid. These days, college is not getting any less expensive. The more debt that students incur, the worse situation it puts them in after they graduate.

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) makes it possible for grants to be given to students based on the family's income. The maximum amount the student can receive is \$6,453 per year. This is money given to the student for going to school; it does not need to be paid back.

Along with the FAFSA, students should fill out the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA). This application is much like the FAFSA, but is exclusive to Florida. This application gives the student access to many scholarships to include Bright Futures. If qualified, the student could get the first two years to a state college paid for, which could be up to \$20,000!

After grants, there are scholarships. They are similar to grants in that the money doesn't need to be paid back. These give money to the applicant based on a certain criteria like academic, athletic, first generation college, ethnic group. There are a few meetings coming up to help you fill these forms out.
